### **We Belong - Building Community to Revolutionize Classroom Management**

Belonging is the foundation for a positive learning environment. If your students feel they belong, learning will improve and behavioral disruptions will diminish. This series will offer targeted strategies that will increase belonging, support learning success, and promote social-emotional growth.

#### **Dr. Laurie Barron**

Dr. Laurie Barron is currently the superintendent of the Evergreen School District in Kalispell, Montana and is the 2021 Montana Superintendent of the Year. Barron co-authored *We Belong: 50 Strategies to Create Community and Revolutionize Classroom Management* (ASCD, 2021), *Middle School: A Place to Belong and Become* (AMLE, 2018), and *What Parents Need to Know about Common Core and Other College- and Career-Ready Standards* (World Book, 2015) and has authored numerous education articles.

#### **Patti Kinney**

Patti Kinney is the principal of Talent Middle School.
